Sub: Desk Review Meetings to assess implementation of Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) during 2016-17

The Desk Review Meetings (State wise) were convened at Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi on and from 21st Nov, 2016 to 25th Nov, 2016 and on 5th December, 2016, 8th December, 2016 and 14th December, 2016 chaired by Smt. Neerja Addidam, Joint Secretary, Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY).

- 2. The basic purpose of the Desk-Meeting was review of physical/financial progress of ongoing projects including projects commenced during current year; status of utilization of funds and eligibility of States for receiving second installment fund under RKVY; utilization of funds and physical progress in respect of Sub-schemes under RKVY; reconciliation of Utilization Certificates, revalidation of funds; RDMIS updating / completion of database, reconciliation of financial progress as per RDMIS with UCs submitted, issues related to data entry, suggestions of revamping of RKVY scheme beyond XII plan, submission of next year proposal in DPR format/status of monitoring of 25% projects submission by end of December 2016, Geo-tagging of assets created under RKVY; the uploading of success stories in RDMIS etc.
- 3. The condition of utilization of funds till date for the year 2016-17 as well as for previous years and the position of unspent balance lying, if any, were discussed in details in respect of the States participated in the meetings held between 21st Nov, 2016 to 25th Nov, 2016 and on 5th December, 2016 and 8th December, 2016 and 14th December, 2016.
- 4. The Chairperson and Director (RKVY) categorically advised the participating States that in order to be eligible for getting the second installment of RKVY fund for the year 2016-17 the following conditions should be fulfilled:
 - 1. 100% Utilization Certificates (UCs) for the funds released up to previous financial year by 7th December
 - Utilization Certificates (UCs) / Expenditure of at least 60% of funds (both Central share and State share) released in first installment during current year by 15th December; and
 - Submission of performance report in terms of physical and financial achievements as well as outcomes, on a quarterly basis, within the stipulated time frame in specified format.

- 5. Further, in the meeting, compliance of the following conditions by all the States concerned has been emphasized and the participating States have also been advised to take timely action:
 - The States should prepare the next year proposal in DPR format provided to them, States were asked to submit project proposal in soft copy.
 - ii) Status of monitoring of 25% projects submission by end of December; from the next year onwards weightage would be given to the monitoring and evaluation component, accordingly the States were advised to take this in SLSC and get approved, RDMIS in-charge was instructed to add a link to upload monitoring and evaluation reports.
 - iii) Regular updating of Status of Projects on the RDMIS.
- 6. It was noted that many States were facing difficulties in RDMIS entry during the current year. Chairperson directed the technical staff concerned of DAC&FW to sort out the technical issues in RDMIS data entry and also advised the States to sort out the problems of connectivity and software issues at their end. Some States asked for imparting training / handholding for their technical personnel for this purpose. This was agreed to in principle.
- It was also informed to the States that Geo-tagging of RKVY assets is taken in four States on pilot basis and later on it will be rolled out in all States.
- 8. State wise summary of discussions and List of participants are annexed.

DESK REVIEW MEETINGS WITH STATES REPRESENTATIVES FOR ASSESSING PROGRESS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF RKVY DURING THE F.Y. 2016-17

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSIONS

ANDHRA PRADESH

- Regarding the establishment of Custom Hiring Centers the State was advised to ensure the quality of implements, repairs. It was also advised to encourage unemployed youth to come forward for establishment of workshops as entrepreneurship to the extent possible.
- The State was advised to take organic farming proposals including ZBNF and NPM under PKVY.
- State was advised to link up the processing groups with market and strengthen them. State was advised to shift the Sericulture activities from RKVY to Central Silk Board from next year onwards.
- For Animal Husbandry projects already approved by SLPSC, Chairperson advised to pursue the matter of clearance from Animal Husbandry Deptt. (GOI).
- The State was advised not to take up fundamental research projects of Universities under RKVY. It was also brought to the knowledge that the same projects have been submitted to ICAR and RKVY which later on creates problems in allocation and release.
- Regarding the incomplete RDMIS entries of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana before the creation of new State, it was advised that both the States mutually discuss and finalize the entries in the form of 'abandoned' or 'completed' projects instead of 'work in progress'.
- The State was also advised to reduce the number of projects and insist more on infrastructure projects.
- The State has furnished UCs and physical and financial reports required for release of second installment of funds.

ARUNACHAL PRADESH

- The Nodal Officer of the State for RKVY informed that there are total 41 projects approved for this Financial Year.
- He also informed that area expansion programme in production growth component is very essential to continue in RKVY to reduce Jhoom cultivation. Last year the approved project from SLSC on area expansion was not approved under RKVY.
- The Chairperson advised the State to limit the number of project and to take the projects in priority areas.
- Regarding the RDMIS entries Chairperson and the Director (RKVY) advised to conduct the training at Guwahati and directed in-charge RDMIS to organize.

ASSAM

It was noted that the State faces challenges of high rainfall and floods; diseases due to humidity; no irrigation facility; low credit flow etc...

> The State was advised to desist from approving large number of projects and projects for demonstration and, instead, stress on infrastructure

projects.

> The State was advised to send proposal for adjustment of the unspent balance of Rs.12.40 crore of the year 2013-14 in some scheme as soon

as possible.

> Chairperson instructed US (RKVY) to send the DO letters from her to the Principal Secretaries about the unspent balances of the previous years.

BIHAR

> State Govt. has not prepared DAPs and SAP; there are no RDMIS entries for 2015-16 and 2016-17.

> Bihar expressed its willingness to refund the amount remaining unutilized or unspent pertaining to NMPS sub-scheme for the years

2012-13 and 2013-14 which was agreed to.

> It was pointed out to the State Nodal Officer that while State govt. is mentioning about un-spent balance of BGREI of Rs.51.94 crore in 2014-15, there is no mention about un-spent balance of Normal RKVY of Rs.37.71 crore in the same year.

> Chairperson also advised the State Nodal Officer, Bihar to send the Data Entry Operator with all details to finalize the RDMIS entries here

only and directed RDMIS In-charge for compliance.

GOA

> The State has furnished UCs for more than 60% against release of funds in 2015-16 and it has done entries in RDMIS. The State also requested for RDMIS training to the staff of line Departments, Chairperson directed RDMIS in-charge for compliance. Sate also assured to release matching state share.

> The State Govt. has assigned the task of evaluation of 25% projects to

NABCONS.

 Director (RKVY), DAC&FW advised the State Govt. to organize early implementation of projects after getting the first installment release so that the State is able to get the second installment.

The State was also advised to put some success stories through RDMIS

entries.

Chairperson advised the States to take up the Hydroponic Fodder Programme on the lines of Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra.

Regarding revamping of RKVY, Goa suggested for considering sharing

pattern of 90:10 between centre and state.

GUJARAT

The Nodal Officer of the State assured that the pending UC will be submitted by 10th December for the year 2016-17. It was conveyed to the State representative that the cumulative UC of two years together submitted by the State Government does not show the actual position, therefore, the State was requested to furnish year-wise separate UCs.

Regarding the impact of RKVY in the State the Nodal Officer informed that there is increase in mechanization, establishment of Soil Health

laboratories and strengthening of KVKs.

The Chairperson advised to reduce the number of projects in the next plan and add projects related to entrepreneurship, innovations and of skill upgradation.

> The Nodal Officer also suggested to increase the administrative

expenses / allocation from 1% to 5%.

The Nodal Officer also raised a point that if there is no norms / scheme / guideline, how to go for those projects. Chairperson advised to follow their State norms in such situations.

HARYANA

The Nodal Officer Haryana informed that the unspent balance of the year 2011-12 and 2012-13 have been surrendered and a copy of the

same will be sent again.

Joint Director, Extension / Nodal Officer, Haryana raised an important issue about the release of RKVY Budget which the State has received three months back, but the implementing agency have received only 15 days back. This delayed release at the State level is a big problem. In view of this, Chairperson advised Director, RKVY to send a letter from Secretary, Agriculture, GOI to the Chief Secretaries in all the States.

The Nodal Officer informed that the CDP programme with DBT is a problem in implementation of this programme as no farmer is interested

to replace Paddy crop by Maize.

Regarding the Geo-tagging, Chairperson informed that NRSC, Hyderabad is developing an app to bring all the infrastructure in one platform.

The Nodal Officer informed that by this month end they will finalise the tender to allot the monitoring and evaluation work to some agency.

HIMACHAL PRADESH

The State was advised that the progress of the project and the work plan for the next financial year may proceed simultaneously

Chairperson also suggested to reduce the number of projects and take

up more infrastructure projects.

Regarding the monitoring of the 25% project work the Nodal Officer, RKVY, HP informed that they have given the monitoring work to NABCON and the work is in progress. Chairperson also apprised the State about the Geo-tagging which is an app. made by National Remote Sensing Centre trial of which is on in four States.

> State was advised to make entries of success stories in the RDMIS link

/ format.

Regarding the suggestion on revamping the Nodal Officer, Himachal Pradesh suggested to have separate budget / schemes norms for hilly States, he also suggested that the States who are spending 10% of their state plan budget on agriculture and allied sectors should be incentivized.

Director, Fisheries, HP told that they are establishing Kitchen fish pond, community fish pond, construction of trout race unit and also raising

Poly House above the fish ponds.

The DD, Horticulture, HP told that regarding infrastructure they are establishing Anti Hail Nets, Mushroom Units, Poly House and drip irrigation system under RKVY.

The Director, Animal Husbandry, HP told that they are establishing Poly Clinics, Jet Spray waxing of Goats and Sheep, vaccination to control Foot and mouth disease and doing research in Animal Husbandry.

Chairperson advised to set up Fodder Banks and take up Hydroponic Fodder Production Programme as taken up by Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. She suggested that ropeways can be taken up for logistics under infrastructure.

JHARKHAND

➤ It was noted that the State has not made entries of projects in RDMIS of RKVY for the current FY and there is no up-dating of RDMIS entries for 2014-15 and before. The State Govt was advised to send their Data Entry Operator / RDMIS person to Delhi to understand the RDMIS system and complete the entries.

> The Stat Govt informed that it is proposed to assign monitoring of the

25% projects from 2009-10 to NABCONS.

The Stat has sought revalidation of un spent balances of past years.

KARNATAKA

Karnataka has unspent balance of Rs.0.76 crore in the year 2013-14 pertaining to sub-schemes VIUC and RADP and unspent balance of Rs.6.59 crore in the year 2015-16. The State representative informed that UC for 2015-16 will be furnished within a week.

During 2016-17, the State has utilized more than 60% funds for which UCs including State share will be furnished by 15th December, 2016. The Nodal Officer of State was advised to divert old unspent budget to the current year and send a letter to revalidate or to surrender. State was advised to submit the UC of Rs.6.59 crore by 7th December.

> The monitoring 25% projects is being done in parts and the reports

will be submitted / uploaded in due course.

- The Nodal Officer informed that the CDP Budget of the State share will be released soon after doing the provision in the State Budget.
- > She also told that they have submitted the evaluation report.
- Regarding the GEO tagging they are organizing a workshop immediately. Chairperson advised for updation in Geo-tagging first enter the bigger projects, immovable assets and then movable assets.

KERALA

It was noted that Kerala has not released fund as yet and hence there is no progress report for 2016-17.

State needs to sort out issue of UCs of small amounts for the years

2011-12 to 2014-15 besides giving 100% UCs for 2015-16.

Chairperson advised to the Nodal Officer, Kerala to divert all unspent funds of sub-schemes which are now closed to the main RKVY scheme.

Principal Secretary, Kerala informed that the State is working on five fold programme in agriculture i.e. Conservation of indigenous varieties, Farm mechanization, Farm to fork, Vegetable production and agro-forestry. They are conducting rice demonstrations, establishing Seed Banks to conserve the indigenous varieties of rice.

Regarding revamping of RKVY, they will convey suggestions after

organizing a workshop.

MADHYA PRADESH

The Nodal Officer, RKVY, MP told that they have submitted the latest UCs. For the year 2015-16 against release of Rs.117.17 crore, only Rs.23.00 crore is unspent.

The Nodal Officer, MP told that the monitoring of the 25% project work has given to Datamation Consultancy Services for 2012-13 and 2013-

Evaluation report will be uploaded on RDMIS.

The Nodal Officer, RKVY, MP apprised about the ongoing schemes under RKVY such as popularization of Hybrid Maize, Guargum production, conservation of seeds of Bajra, Kodo, model Solar fencing, digging of tube-well and strengthening of soil testing labs etc..

The State representative further informed that the division of budget in the State is in the ratio of 60:40 for infrastructure and production growth; he also assured about speedy progress in RDMIS entries.

Director, Agriculture Engineering, MP told about the mechanization programme taken under RKVY are subsidy on implements, establishment of 1500 Nos. of custom hiring centres, hi-tech custom hiring centres. He also told that use of Sugarcane harvester promoted under RKVY has a huge impact on increase in sugar percentage up to 1% and timely sowing of sugarcane crop for the next year. It is proposed to link all 1500 Custom Hiring centres with Toll Free Numbers. A film has also been made on custom hiring centres, Chairperson advised them to upload the success story and film on RDMIS link and directed

In-charge RDMIS for immediate compliance. Director, Agriculture Engineering, MP also told that they are creating a network of 25000 Tractors/Farmers by filling the gap of equipments/implements. He also told about their scheme of "Haldhar" and "Yantradoot" for deep ploughing by rotavator, increased the productivity. He also told that they are establishing 6 skill development centre for mechanization and five are under final stage of completion.

- Director Fishries informed that 20% water-bodies of India are in MP. They are providing net to the Fishermen on 50% grant. They are constructing Fish Market. Chairperson advised to upload success stories on RDMIS.
- ➤ In horticulture, they are promoting betel-vine cultivation under tunnel as per the project cost of Rs. 1.20 Lakhs for 500 Sq Mt area with 35% cost as subsidy to the farmers. They have also distributed Minikits of watermelon, and other vegetable seeds. They are promoting Pomegranate cultivation under drip irrigation in 2000 Hectare area per year. They have created 1.25 Lakh Tonne of Onion storage from the overall plan of 5.0 lakh Tonne under RKVY.
- ➤ Under FMD-CP, out of Rs. 16.00 Crore they have developed FMD control vaccine for 1 Year booster doses a complete vaccination programme. It was also told that Polyclinic establishment programme and Disease Investigation labs are completed in 51 districts under RKVY.In Dairy development, their milk brand "Sanchi" competes with "Amul". Chairperson advised all states that the vegetable marketing programme could be organized like milk procurement and marketing programme.

MAHARASHTRA

- Maharashtra representatives conveyed that they will endeavour to furnish 100% UCs of 2015-16 by 20th December and 60% UCs fo 2016-17 releases by 25th December, 2016.
- The Director, Agriculture, Maharashtra informed that they have closed the demonstration programmes and concentrating on promotion of projects in PPP Mode.
- On query from Chairperson about the Ruchi Soya Project, he informed that in the Ruchi Soya Project, RKVY support is on backward linkage and the corporate group is managing the forward linkage. He informed that Soya Oil is produce under this Project and the tomato varieties which are not suitable for puree making are replaced and generating electricity through Bio gas / Cotton Bio Waste which will be purchased by the State Government. There are three such other projects with Pepsico, Coca Cola, Jain Irrigation in coordination with Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation. Pepsico is establishing a Juice extraction plant in Nander for Orange like Valencia in Brazil.
- The Nodal Officer told that there are 39 projects taken up in this financial year.
- It was informed that over 80% of the Stat is dryland. Polythene lining for farm ponds is being supported through RKVY.

MANIPUR

State was asked to furnish UC of Rs.13.55 crore of 2015-16 alongwith physical / financial progress report.

State to furnish revised physical / financial progress report of 2016-

17 matching with UCs furnished.

State to spend State Share also and give report.

State, if they so desire, may approve more projects for getting full allocation.

RDMIS entry to be done for 2015-16, 2016-17.

Chief Secretaries approval for FMD and RPS sub-schemes may be given to facilitate release of funds.

List of approved projects to be given.

MEGHALAYA

The Nodal Officer RKVY Meghalaya informed that they have 64 projects approved by SLSC in the current year. The Chairperson advised to limit the number of projects.

The monitoring work for the 25% project area has not yet been

given.

The State was advised to complete the project wise entries with little brief about the project in RDMIS.

MIZORAM

Director, RKVY given emphasis to increase innovative and

infrastructure related projects in coming plan.

The Nodal Officer, Mizoram asked for the RDMIS training, Director, RKVY advised to select 2-3 officers from all line Departments and the RDMIS training could be conducted in Guwahati with other adjoining States of Nagaland, Meghalaya, Manipur and Assam. The Director, RKVY praised about uploading of success stories in RDMIS. The State was advised to reduce the number of projects.

> 25% projects of 2013-14 and 2014-15 were evaluated by University of

Mizoram.

> Success stories uploaded on RKVY website.

NAGALAND

It was informed that the UC submitted is not correct and the Dy. Director assured to send the corrected UC by Monday. The Nodal Officer, Nagaland informed that they have approved 43 projects in SLSC. He also told that the RKVY Scheme has an excellent impact in rainfed and hilly areas of Nagaland.

Director, RKVY advised to organize independent evaluation of the

25% project work.

The Nodal Officer told that they have identified success stories and soon they will upload through the RDMIS link. The Nodal Officer informed about the lack of core banking facilities and poor transportation system in the State, in view of that it was suggested to bring all these issues in revamping suggestions through a letter.

ODISHA

- Chairperson asked for the UC of Rs.2.84 crore for the year 2014-15. The Nodal Officer, Odisha told that this was delayed because of the land issue, he also told that the budget of Rs.37.00 crore for the year 2015-16 have been disbursed.
- Chairperson advised to upload the monitoring and evaluation report in the RDMIS, she also advised to reduce the number of projects and this is applicable to all States.
- Chairperson also advised to submit success story on "Udyan Fresh" and "Cage of Fisheries" projects in RDMIS.

PUNJAB

- The Nodal Officer RKVY Punjab informed that the Crop Diversification Programme of Rs.16.18 crore is adjusted for the year 2013-14 and for the year 2014-15.
- The Chairperson advised to complete the Diversification Programme and suggested the Nodal Officer to provide the breakup of UCs.
- Regarding release of State share, the Chairperson instructed to put up a DO letter to the Chief Secretary, Punjab from the Secretary Agriculture, Government of India.
- The Nodal Officer Punjab suggested that SLSC meeting should be organized in a time line and it should be two in a year in October and in January.
- He also suggested to call all the States to explain about their project, innovations and success stories through presentation at Central RKVY meetings.

RAJASTHAN

- The Nodal Officer, Rajasthan told that 63% of the expenditure has been already done and the monitoring agency for the 25% project is also hired.
- Regarding the RDMIS entries, they are in contact with RDMIS incharge, RKVY(DAC&FW) to resolve all related matters.
- Success stories have been uploaded on the RKVY website.
- Chairperson asked about the interest on RKVY funds, if there are any, apart from treasury accounts and advised to organize the same.
- Chairperson advised to cut down number of projects and also instructed to issue advisories to the States from the central level.
- State was advised to study schemes M/o Food Processing Industries so that that projects related to food processing and value addition are not replicated under RKVY.

Regarding the research projects, such as hydroponics, going on in the Universities, State Govt. representative was advised to ask for the cost benefit analysis of such research and ways for its utilization by farmers.

SIKKIM

- The Secretary of Agriculture, Sikkim told that they are promoting infrastructural projects in extraction of aromatic plants. The Chairperson advised to link up such projects with the farmers and market.
- Regarding the RDMIS entries, it was discussed that it should be strengthened and directed in-charge RDMIS to coordinate and organize training / hand-holding.
- New success stories to be uploaded by the State Government on the website through the given link.
- The State was informed to utilize FMD-CP fund for implementing this project and utilize the normal for other projects.

TAMILNADU

- The Nodal Officer, Tamil Nadu told that they have given monitoring and evaluation work for 2014-15 to M/s DHAN Foundation.
- > The State has sought the second release (additional) of funds

TELANGANA

- Chairperson advised the State Nodal Officer, RKVY to upload success stories on the RKVY Website through RDMIS entry from the State end.
- > The State Govt has not yet done the monitoring of 25% projects.
- Regarding the revamping of RKVY the State representative suggested for budgetary allocation of 80:20 for infrastructure and production growth; monitoring should be included as a parameter for inter-state allocation of funds with weightage of 5-10%.
- > State Govt. has released last year's State share only recently.
- State Govt. has not submitted progress report. State Govt. has not yet approved sufficient projects to claim full allocation.

TRIPURA

- The Nodal Officer RKVY Tripura informed that no UC is pending for the year 2015-16 and they have already submitted 60% UC for the year 2016-17.
- He also informed that their Budget for this year was drastically reduced which may be increased and Rs.20 crore additional fund may be released in the current financial year.
- It was informed that they are establishing 85 farmer knowledge centres for 1100 villages in the State, some of them will be established under RKVY.

Regarding the demonstration, Chairperson advised to limit number of demonstrations or there should be no demonstrations from

coming years.

Regarding the pisciculture project there is convergence with MGNREGA for farm ponds for fisheries where land is not fit for paddy cultivation. Chairperson advised the Nodal Officer to submit this as success story as an example of convergence.

The Nodal Officer told that regarding the monitoring of 25% project

area, the work has been already given.

The Chairperson advised other States to emulate Tripura for tendering process implemented for selection of monitoring agency.

UTTARAKHAND

State was advised to surrender unutilized balance of Rs.2.0 lakh unspent balance of 2011-12 and submit the UC for the year 2014-15 immediately.

The State govt. has assigned the monitoring of 25% projects to

the Planning Department of the State.

Regarding the Organic Farming Programme, State is going for certification for domestic consumption. Chairperson advised that now there is separate budget allocated under PKVY which should be utilized first. She also advised to upload success stories of Organic Farming on website through the given link.

State informed that they are implementing 40 projects including

35 ongoing and 5 new this year.

State stressed on the need for protecting agriculture from wild > animals. Representative of NSC, who are implementing a project of chain link fencing, sought release of funds.

UTTAR PRADESH

The Nodal Officer of the State for RKVY has been advised to submit the UC pending for the year 2014-15 in NMPS of Rs. 2.37 crore and Vegetable Cluster of Rs.3.87 crore as soon as possible.

The Nodal Officer informed that the monitoring and evaluation work has been entrusted to NPC and Giri Institute of Development Studies for the year 2012-13 and 2013-14. For the year 2015-16, the tender is under process.

The State was advised to upload the success stories in RDMIS

through the given link.

WEST BENGAL

The Nodal Officer RKVY West Bengal informed that last year the State had spent Rs.46.37 crore more than the State share which they are adjusting in the current financial year. He also informed that all projects approved by SLSC were taken up despite less budget.

> The Chairperson advised the Nodal Officer to update the UC

positions.

Regarding the RDMIS entries, the Nodal Officer told that the DPR are not getting uploaded. Chairperson directed in-charge of RDMIS to sort out the same.

> The Nodal Officer West Bengal told that they have given the

monitoring work to for 25% projects.

The Chairperson also advised to put the project monitoring details on whatsapp.
