# MINUTES OF THE STATE LEVEL SANCTION COMMITTEE MEETING OF RASHTRIYA KRISHI VIKAS YOJANA (RKVY) HELD ON 24.10.2016 AT 12.00 NOON IN THE CHAMBERS OF CHIEF SECRETARY, CAMP OFFICE, VIJAYAWADA.

The State Level Sanction Committee Meeting of Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) was held on 24.10.2016 under the Chairmanship of Sri. S.P. Tucker, I.A.S., Chief Secretary, Govt. of A.P.

The list of Officers attended the meeting is appended in the Annexure.

At the outset, the Director of Agriculture, Govt. of A.P. while welcoming the members to the meeting, informed that the Govt. of India has allocated an amount of Rs. 345.64 crores under RKVY and also informed that the previous SLSC meeting held on 22.07.2016 has approved projects of different sectors for worth of Rs. 372.37 Crores as detailed below:

The Director of Agriculture has further informed that some of the sectors have proposed supplementary project proposals and the present meeting is intended to approve the supplementary projects of different sectors for the year 2016-17.

The Chief Secretary, Govt. of A.P. has stressed that in view of the bifurcation of the State, there is necessity to create huge physical infrastructure facilities in the State and suggested to give priority for Infrastructure projects under RKVY to attain better growth rate in Agriculture and allied sectors.

The Chief Secretary also advised to give emphasis for need based issues in planning the projects instead of traditional way of planning.

The Joint Secretary (RKVY), Govt. of India has emphasized that RKVY is giving priority for infrastructure projects and there is a scope for 100% conversion to infrastructure under RKVY. She further stressed that the proposals in future shall be for improving infrastructure with focus on long term benefits rather than distributing funds to different schemes without any tangible results.

The Director of Research, SVVU has proposed an addl. project on strengthening the infrastrucutural facilities towards development of various value added dairy products at college of Dairy Technology with an outlay of Rs. 199.95 lakhs as detailed below:

a. Dairy plant including value added products
b. Marketing and Training Infrastructure
c. Transportation of milk & milk products
d. Total
e. Rs. 113.50 lakhs.
e. Rs. 70.45 lakhs.
e. Rs. 16.00 lakhs.
e. Rs. 199.95 lakhs.

The Secretary (Agriculture ) advised to propose this project during next year proposals of RKVY.

The Joint Secretary, RKVY, GoI has opined that the project may be considered with the available savings from other projects.

The Spl. Chief Secretary, AH, DD & F has requested for allocation of Rs. 100.00 lakhs from the current year budget and Rs. 99.95 lakhs in next year budget.

The Committee approved the project subject to the availability of savings from other projects.

## 4. Proposal for Establishment of Germplasm conservation plant by ANGRAU.

The Director of Research, ANGRAU has stated that there is need to establish Germplasm Conservation Plant in view of State bifurcation for maintenance of germplasm for research and requested for allocation of Rs. 10.00 crores under RKVY during 2016-17.

The Director of Agriculture has advised to prepare a detailed project report on Germplasm Conservation Plant for considering in next year RKVY proposals.

The Joint Secretary (RKVY) has advised not to exceed beyond the budgeted allocations for projecting the projects.

Totally projects worth of Rs. 416.02 Crores (1st SLSC: Rs. 348.26 Cr. +  $2^{nd}$  SLSC: Rs. 67.76 Cr.) are sanctioned from both SLSC meetings, which is with in the 150% limit of RKVY guidelines. The Sector wise and project wise outlays sanctioned are shown in Annexure I & II.

Projects sanctioned over and above GoI allocation would be considered subject to availability of savings from other projects.

### The Joint Secretary, RKVY, GoI has stressed on the following points:

- Suggested to take up limited No. of projects with bigger infrastructure instead of too many smaller projects.
- Advised for completion of data uploading in RKVY Data Management Information System (RDMIS)
- Advised for submission of project wise Utilization Certificates.

Advised for completion of 3rd party monitoring of 25% RKVY projects, as the CAG has pointed out on weak monitoring of RKVY projects.

Requested for furnishing of ICAR project reports and study reports of research projects.

 Advised for uploading of success stories of different projects in web portal of RKVY.

The Joint Secretary, GoI further informed that Geotagging will done for assets created under RKVY and a pilot scheme is already launched in 4 states with coordination of National Remote Sensing Centre, Hyderabad. Andhra Pradesh will be included in the next phase.

The Director of Agriculture has informed that Andhra Pradesh is already in foremost place in implementing Geotagging of assets of different schemes of other departments like bore wells etc.,

The Secretary (Agriculture) has advised to create a separate web portal for RKVY activities exclusively.

The Director of Agriculture has informed that 3rd party monitoring and evaluation of RKVY projects for the years 2013-14 & 2014-15 is already entrusted to National Institute of Rural Development (NIRD), Rajendranagar and the final report is awaited and also clarified that the success stories already uploaded in web portal.

The Director of Agriculture has requested all the sectors to furnish project wise utilization certificates for onward submission to Govt. of India.

The Joint Secretary, RKVY, GoI has assured that addl. funds will be considered for allocation to Andhra Pradesh from the laggard states with under budget utilization.

As you are aware, the Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) had launched a Centrally Sponsored Scheme - National Mission on Food Processing (NMFP) for implementation through States / UTs in 12th Plan (w.e.f. 01.04.2012). Funding pattern for this Mission is in the ratio of 75:25 by Government of India and States; for North Eastern States the ratio is 90:10 and 100% grant for UTs. An amount of GOI share of Rs.25.28 crore was released to your State since inception of the Mission.

- In the Union Budget (2015-16) presented on 28.02.2015, Government of India (GOI) has announced that the NMFP would be delinked for financial assistance from Central Government. It is further mentioned that the States may decide to continue (or not) NMFP scheme out of their increased resources resulting from the recommendations of the 14th Finance Commission. A list of delinked schemes announced in the budget. 2015-16 is annexed. Therefore, no GOI funds would be available for implementation of NMFP from FY- 2015-16 and onwards.
- As per MIS of NMFP of the Ministry, Government of Andhra Pradesh has sanctioned 28 projects amounting to Rs.62.52 crore under various schemes of NMFP till now. Since the Mission has been delinked for financial assistance from GOI in 2015-16, you are requested to ensure release of funds to all the ongoing projects approved by SLEC including the committed liabilities from the States resources. Further, the State Government is also requested to take a decision for implementing the scheme of NMFP or otherwise w.e.f. 01.04.2015-and onwards. To enable the State Government, this Ministry is sending the soft copy of existing NMFP guidelines through email for ready reference.


