Minutes of the meeting of State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY-RAFTAAR) held under the Chairmanship of Sh. B.K. Agarwal, Chief Secretary, Govt. of Himachal Pradesh on 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 at 10:30 AM.

### The list of participants is enclosed at Annexure-I.

At the outset, the Principal Secretary (Agri.) to the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh welcomed the Chairman, representative of Govt. of India and other members of State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) and gave a brief overview of RKVY-RAFTAAR. Thereafter, he informed that during 2019-20, an allocation of ₹24.10 Crore (90% Central Share) in favour of H.P. under RKVY has been conveyed by Govt. of India. However, the total funds to the tune of ₹26.78 Crore would be available for current financial year on 90:10 sharing basis.

### Item No. 1: Project Proposals for the year 2019-20:

The members of SLSC were informed that the meeting of State Level Project Screening Committee (SLPSC) was held on 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2019 in which different stakeholder departments presented their project proposals. All the stakeholder departments were requested to re-submit the revised project proposals, keeping in view the guidelines/observations of the Screening Committee. Accordingly, the revised project proposals submitted by different stakeholders were sent to the Govt. of India and NITI Aayog through courier as well as e-mail on 18<sup>th</sup> April, 2019. Thereafter, the pre-SLSC meeting was convened at Govt. of India level on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2019 which was also attended by representatives of all the stakeholder departments of Himachal Pradesh.

It was further informed that in this meeting, 31 projects worth ₹5294.47 lakh (15 projects worth ₹2633.73 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 4 projects worth ₹1198.70 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production and 12 projects worth ₹1462.04 lakh under Flexi Funds stream) would be presented by



different stakeholders for approval. Thereafter, sector-wise presentation/discussions of projects proposed for sanction/approval for 2019-20 was made as under:

### Horticulture:

The Director of Horticulture Department posed 4 project proposals under infrastructure & assets stream amounting to ₹326.24 lakh. After detailed deliberations, all the projects were approved by the SLSC as per detail given in Annexure-II. However, the concerned department was also advised to comply with the observations/comments of Govt. of India.

### UHF, Nauni:

The representative of UHF, Nauni posed 2 project proposals (1 project worth ₹149.99 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets and 1 project worth ₹43.00 lakh under Flexi Funds Stream) amounting to ₹192.99 lakh. After comprehensive discussions, both the projects as per detail given at Annexure-II were approved by the Committee.

### **Animal Husbandry**:

The Director of Animal Husbandry posed 6 projects worth ₹1239.00 lakh (2 projects worth ₹352.00 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 2 projects worth ₹405.70 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production and 2 projects worth ₹481.30 lakh under Flexi Funds Stream).

Keeping in view the comments/observations of Govt. of India and priorities of the Department, 5 projects amounting to ₹866.30 lakh (i.e. 2 projects under Infrastructure & Assets amounting to ₹312.00 lakh & 2 projects under Value Addition Linked Production worth ₹375.00 lakh and 1 project under Flexi Funds stream worth ₹179.30 lakh) were approved by the SLSC in respect of Animal Husbandry sector. The project titled "Provision of Quality Artificial Insemination Services at the Door Step of the Farmers" was not approved by the Committee as the said project was not supported by the Govt. of India.



### Veterinary College:

The representative of Veterinary College, CSKHPKV, Palampur posed 5 projects worth ₹108.75 lakh (2 projects worth ₹50.00 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 3 projects worth ₹58.75 lakh under Flexi Funds Stream). The Committee approved all the projects as per detail given at **Annexure-II**, subject to the modification in the proposals as suggested by ICAR/Govt. of India.

### Fisheries:

The discussions on 3 project proposals worth ₹122.10 lakh (i.e. 2 projects worth ₹92.10 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets and 1 project worth ₹30.00 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production) in respect of Fisheries Department were held.

After detailed deliberations, the Committee approved all the projects. The Fisheries Department was also advised to comply with the observations of Govt. of India regarding submission of Success Stories of earlier constructed community ponds in Scheduled Caste Concentrated Villages under RKVY in Himachal Pradesh.

### Industries:

The Nodal department informed the Committee that project proposal titled "Development of Integrated Support System for Livelihood Improvement of Sericulture Farmers of Himachal Pradesh" amounting to ₹260.00 lakh of Industries Department was not supported by the Govt. of India.

On this, the representative of Department of Industries informed that the Central Silk Board has supported the said project during 2018-19 but due to less allocation of funds from Govt. of India under RKVY during 2018-19, only ₹125.00 lakh was approved by the SLSC, hence, some of the activities could not be implemented during the said year. Therefore, the said project has again been posed for funding under RKVY during 2019-20. He further added that the components/activities taken under this project are not covered under Silk Samagra Scheme. Keeping in view the importance of the project, the Committee approved it for ₹100.00 lakh.



### Agriculture:

The Department of Agriculture presented 5 project proposals amounting to ₹2546.40 lakh (2 projects worth ₹1377.40 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 1 project worth ₹763.00 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production and 2 projects amounting to ₹406.00 lakh under Flexi Funds).

The representative of the department informed that the project titled "Natural Resources Management for Sustainable Livelihoods in Himachal Pradesh" shall be implemented in participatory mode through Krishak Vikas Sanghs and about 2000 beneficiaries (small & marginal, weaker section of society whose land have been damaged due to heavy rains and landslides) are likely to be benefited and about 1200 ha. cultivated land will be protected under this project. The said project has also been supported by Govt. of India. After comprehensive deliberations, the project was approved.

The project titled "Strengthening of Agricultural Infrastructure" amounting to ₹585.40 lakh was supported by the Govt. of India, therefore, the SLSC approved the project as such.

The representative of the Nodal department informed that the project titled "Improved livelihood from Diversified Agriculture through Vegetable cultivation" amounting to ₹763.00 lakh has been supported by Govt. of India as per MIDH/ATMA/SFAC norms. Although, the component/activity relating to promotion of Open Pollinated Vegetable Seeds (as per VIUC norms) under area expansion of vegetables is not covered under MIDH, however, keeping in view the importance of vegetable cultivation in enhancing the farmers income, the SLSC also supported this activity on MIDH assistance norm (i.e. 50% assistance).

In nutshell, the Committee approved all the projects worth ₹2283.40 lakh (2 projects worth ₹1377.40 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 1 project worth ₹600 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production and 2 projects amounting to ₹306.00 lakh under Flexi Funds) in respect of Agriculture Department.

### CSKHPKV, Palampur:

The representative of CSKHPKV, Palampur posed 5 projects worth ₹498.99 lakh (1 project worth ₹26.00 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets and 4

projects worth ₹472.99 lakh under Flexi Funds Stream). After detailed deliberations and keeping in view the recommendations of ICAR and comments/observations of the Govt. of India 4 projects worth ₹199.40 lakh (1 project worth ₹26.00 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, and 3 projects worth ₹173.40 lakh under Flexi Funds Stream) were approved by the Committee. The project titled "Revision/updation of District Agriculture Plans (DAPs), State Agriculture Plan (SAP) and preparation of State Agriculture Infrastructural Development Programme (SAIDP)" amounting to ₹299.59 lakh was not approved by the Committee as the same was not supported by the Govt. of India.

In all, 31 projects worth ₹5294.47 lakh were posed out of which 29 projects worth ₹4149.19 lakh (15 projects worth ₹2383.74 lakh under Infrastructure & Assets, 4 projects worth ₹1005.00 lakh under Value Addition Linked Production and 10 projects worth ₹760.45 lakh under Flexi Funds stream) were approved by the SLSC as per detail given at **Annexure-II**. However, the allocation of funds was restricted to ₹2678.00 (₹2410.00 lakh as Central Share & ₹268.00 lakh as State Share) as per allocation received from GOI.

After detailed deliberations, the funds were allocated in favour of different stakeholders as per the availability by the SLSC which is given at **Annexure-II**. However, allocation of balance amount shall depend upon the additional allocation, if any, received from Govt. of India. The Committee also accorded its approval to use Administrative Cost of 2% by Nodal Department as per the guidelines of RKVY-RAFTAAR.

### Item 2: Ratification of funds under Animal Health Sub Scheme under RKVY 2018-19.

The Principal Secretary (Agri.) informed that the Govt. of India had conveyed an allocation of ₹75.00 lakh (90% Central Share) during July, 2018 under RKVY-RAFTAAR Animal Health Sub Scheme in respect of Himachal Pradesh for the year 2018-19.

The Department of Animal Husbandry, Govt. of H.P. prepared two project proposals titled "Establishment & Strengthening of Veterinary Hospitals and Dispensaries" and "National Project on Brucellosis-Control Program" amounting to ₹67.56 lakh (₹60.81 lakh as Central Share and ₹6.75 lakh as State Share) under Animal Health Sub Scheme for the year 2018-19 keeping in view the comments/observations of Govt. of India and submitted the same to the Nodal department during January, 2019 for its on file approval of Chairman, SLSC under RKVY. Accordingly, the said projects were got approved on file from the Chairman of SLSC (Annexure-III) on 15.01.2019.

He further informed that funds to the tune of ₹30.40 lakh were received from Govt. of India during January, 2019 under Animal Health Sub Scheme under RKVY for the year 2018-19 and the matching state share was ₹3.38 lakh. After discussions, the SLSC ratified the above said project proposals and release of funds under Animal Health Sub Scheme under RKVY 2018-19.

### Item 3: Ratification of State Extension Work Plan under Extension Reforms Scheme for the year 2019-20



The State Extension Work Plan (SEWP) under Extension Reforms Scheme (ATMA) amounting to ₹3133.47 lakh was discussed in the meeting of Inter Departmental Working Group (IDWG) held on 06.03.2019 and recommended the same for approval to SLSC (RKVY). The State Level Sanctioning Committee ratified the State Extension Work Plan for the year 2019-20 which was approved on file by the Chairman of SLSC, with the remarks that expenditure will be limited to actual allocation/availability of funds. The copy of SEWP is at **Annexure-IV**.

During the course of discussion, Director of Agriculture, H.P. apprised the Chairman that during 2018-19, ₹2599.78 lakh (₹2566.00 lakh under Normal RKVY and ₹33.78 lakh under Animal Health Sub Scheme) were released on 90:10 (Central:State). He further informed that out of the funds released during 2018-19, ₹2246.01 lakh has been utilized upto 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2019 and the unspent amount has already been revalidated by the Govt. of India for its utilization during 2019-20. SLSC allowed the concerned stakeholders to utilize the unspent amount of 2018-19 during 2019-20 on the project approved during 2018-19.

In addition to it, ₹14.00 lakh (₹12.60 lakh as Central Share & ₹1.40 lakh as State Share) have also been released under RKVY for Krishi Kalyan Abhiyan during 2018-19 which has also been utilized.

The house was further informed by Director of Agriculture, H.P. that the Utilization Certificates under RKVY for the year 2018-19 have already been received from all the stakeholders except Department of Industries. Therefore, the Chairman directed the representative of Industries Department to submit the same to the Nodal Department immediately so that the consolidated Utilization Certificate could be submitted to the Govt. of India.

The Chairman asked the stakeholders about the impact of different RKVY projects and Monitoring & Evaluation of different projects under RKVY. On this, Director of Agriculture, H.P. informed that the interventions under RKVY in various sectors/fields such as Diversification through vegetable cultivation, minorirrigation schemes, vermi compost and other allied activities like livestock production, marketing & post harvest management have directly or indirectly helped in generating employment and additional income to the farmer household at the village level. In addition to this, a number of infrastructures have also been created through RKVY funding under Agriculture & allied sectors.

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The Director of Agriculture, H.P. also informed the SLSC that 25% of RKVY projects implemented by different stakeholders during 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17 in Himachal Pradesh were got monitored & evaluated through NABCONS and the final reports have also been submitted to RKVY Division, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India. It was further added that Govt. of India had also carried out the Mid Term Evaluation/Impact

Assessment of RKVY projects implemented during 2016-17 through Institute of Economic Growth (IEG), New Delhi.

He also apprised the committee that monitoring & evaluation study of 25% RKVY projects approved during 2017-18 is also in progress and the final report in this regard would be submitted to the Govt. of India after receipt of the same from NABCONS.

In his concluding remarks, the Chairman, SLSC directed all the stakeholders to prepare impact based projects. He also emphasized that projects approved under RKVY be implemented effectively so that the objectives/outcomes as envisaged in the project proposals are achieved in true spirit. The Chairman also directed all the stakeholders to ensure geo-tagging under RKVY and submit success stories under RKVY to the nodal department.

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The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair

SEWP was discussed in the meeting of Inter Departmental Working Group held on 06.03.2019, constituted under the scheme and has recommended it to SLSC (RKVY) for approval.

Work Plan includes seasonal time bound activities and is to be submitted to GoI for release of funds. Meeting of SLSC (RKVY) is yet to be convened as process for finalization of projects is in progress. Hence, it is requested to consider and approve the proposal amounting to Rs. 3133.47 lakh for 2019-20. However, SEWP will be ratified in the regular meeting of SLSC (RKVY). Expenditure will be restricted to actual allocation of 2019-20.
