# Minutes of the Meeting of State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) of RKVY-RAFTAAR, ATMA and PMKSY-BKSY, held on21<sup>st</sup> June, 2021 from the Conference Hall, 13<sup>th</sup> Floor, Nabanna, through Webinar

The State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) Meeting of RKVY-RAFTAAR, ATMA and PMKSY-BKSY was chaired by the Chief Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Shri Hari Krishna Dwivedi.

List of participants attended / joined the meeting is annexed (Annexure-A).

The Chairman greeted the Government of India representatives, members and participants.

He thereafter highlighted decreasing trend of allocation of central share under RKVY during past few years which is making the scheme less attractive among the Stakeholder Departments and requested Shri P. K. Swain, Addl. Secretary, Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare (DAC&FW), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India & Nodal Officer for the State of West Bengal to deliver upon it.

The Additional Secretary discussed the fund flow formula under RKVY which depends on share of non-irrigated area, Small & Marginal Farmers, moving average of the increase in plan expenditure in agriculture & allied sectors, Average State Gross Value Added, youth population and Inverse of Yield Gap with maximum stress being laid upon the moving average of the increase in plan expenditure in agriculture & allied sectors. Thus increasing state expenditure in this sector will help to get higher fund (CSS) flow. He also pointed that the State Government selects the stakeholder departments, the number of which determines departmental fund flow. He also suggested on convergence of activities.

Regarding selection of project, without downplaying the role of longer duration projects of high importance, the Chairman emphasized that new projects having one year duration or similar implementation period should be prioritised.

The Secretary, Agriculture Department, Government of West Bengal & Convenor of SLSC briefly stated basic background of RKVY, objectives and implementation by different stakeholder Department in West Bengal and initiated agenda wise discussion with the permission of the Chair.

# Agenda I: Confirmation of the proceeding of the last SLSC meeting:

Proceeding of the 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of SLSC held on 23/12/2020 was placed before the House for approval.

#### **Decision:**

The minutes of the last (20<sup>th</sup>) SLSC meeting of RKVY held on 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2020 and circulated thereafter have been confirmed by the House.

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# Agenda II: Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana - Remunerative Approaches for Agriculture and Allied sector Rejuvenation (RKVY-RAFTAAR)

# (i-iv): Review of RKVY (Normal) fund utilization during 2017-18 to 2019-20:

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised the house that small amount (Rs. 4.64 crores, including central & state share) of fund was lying unspent for the years 2017-18 to 2019-20 under RKVY.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment Central share of 2020-21 was released on 16/03/2021. Agriculture Department has reviewed the ground level implementation of RKVY projects with Stakeholder Departments and released most of the second instalment to be used in time-bound manner. So far Rs. 150.58 crores was released and Rs. 58.80 crores has been utilised.

Shri P.K. Swain, Addl. Secretary, DAC&FW, Govt. of India stated that the utilization of funds under RKVY of the previous years should be reconciled with DAC&FW data, as figures are seemingly higher as per their records.

### **Decision:**

The Chairman requested the Agriculture Department to expedite fund utilisation and reconciliation with DAC&FW.

# Agenda II

# (v): Approval of RKVY-RAFTAAR Annual Action Plan for the year 2021-22:

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised the house that State Level Project Screening Committee (SLPSC), under RKVY Action Plan of 2021-22 recommended 88 new projects of 8 stakeholder departments including State Agricultural Universities with current year (2021-22) phasing of Rs. 341.99 crores. Besides this, there are 24 ongoing projects having cost Rs. 113.38 crores and 27 spillover projects with cost of Rs. 209.24 crores which could not be taken up due to want of fund.

Thus total current year project cost including New, Ongoing and Spillover projects stands at Rs. 664.61 crores. He elaborated on the new proposals and also informed that against the desired ratio of allocation of 50% for infrastructure, 30% for production oriented and 20% as flexi fund projects, the ratio in the proposed new projects comes to 67%, 17% and 16% respectively; thereby in spite of laying a little more emphasis on infrastructure based projects, a holistic approach has been maintained. He also emphasized upon essentiality of mobility to extension workers for implementation of different development projects.



He elaborated that among 'New Projects', Agriculture Department with SAUs has 31 projects (Project Cost of Rs 151 crores), ARD has 6 projects (Rs. 80.96 crores), Agricultural Marketing has 16 projects (Rs. 42.2 crores), FPI&H has 12 projects (Rs. 21.27 crores), P&RD (WBCADC) has 11 projects (Rs. 17.71 crores), I&W has 6 projects (Rs. 14.53 crores), Cooperation Department has one project (Rs. 9.86 crores) and Fisheries Department has 5 projects (project cost Rs. 4.26 crores).

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised that to accomplish the above works, a cumulative funds of Rs. 472 crores (Central Share + State Share) is expected to be available (Rs. 308.68 crores from 2021-22 Annual Plan allocation plus Rs. 163 crores previous years' balance).

He also submitted that due to MCC for Assembly General Election 2021 and restriction of Covid-19 pandemic, the SLSC meeting was delayed; therefore to ensure that Kharif programme is not disturbed, the Chief Secretary & Chairman of SLSC accorded approval to five (5) new Kharif projects of 2021-22 of Agriculture Department.

SLSC ratified the decision.

The Chairman thereafter invited comments from the Stakeholder Departments and the GoI representatives on proposals as recommended by State Level Project Screening Committee (SLPSC).

# Comments by stakeholder Department:

### **FPI & Horticulture Department:**

Addl. Chief Secretary, FPI & Horticulture Department focussed on taking up beneficiary oriented horticultural projects instead of infrastructure development projects considering the ongoing Covid pandemic. The Secretary, Agriculture clarified that as long as a project is within the approved list, it can be smoothly implemented. Department may prioritise out of approved projects.

### **Fisheries Department:**

The Addl. Chief Secretary, Fisheries Department informed the house that ongoing projects have mostly been completed and the balance funds will be utilized within July, 2021. He apprised the house that the Department will take up 5 new projects immediately after approval of the SLSC.

# **Forest Department:**



The Principal Secretary, Forest Department apprised the house that they have spill over projects of 2020-21 which could not be implemented due to want

of fund earlier. The Department have recently received Rs. 9.00 crores for Natural Resources Management projects. Entire RKVY funds will be utilized within October, 2021.

# **WRID Department:**

The Principal Secretary, WRID Department apprised the house that two ongoing projects are mostly completed except energisation of tube wells. It is expected that the work will be completed by July, 2021. No further new projects will be taken up under RKVY as other schemes are available for Micro Irrigation.

# I & W Department:

The Principal Secretary, I & W Department informed the house that there are six new projects under RKVY with project cost of Rs.14.54 crores on construction of check dams, for consideration of SLSC in 2021-22.

# **Agricultural Marketing Department:**

The Secretary Agricultural Marketing Department apprised the house that there are 13 ongoing projects and 8 spillover projects. Department will prioritize implementation/completion of the ongoing and spill over projects.

# **ARD Department:**

The Special Secretary, ARD Department apprised the house that attempt has been taken to complete ongoing projects by September, 2021. He informed the house that spill over projects will be reviewed before implementation.

#### **GoI** comments:

Shri P.K. Swain, Addl. Secretary (Agri. Marketing & AMA), DAC&FW & Nodal Officer for the State of West Bengal impressed the house that the SLSC may in-principle approve RKVY projects up to 150% of the allocation during a particular year. Thus considering the current year's (2021-22) allocation of Rs. 308.68 crores (Central Share + State Share), the SLSC may consider projects with overall project cost around Rs. 460 crores under RKVY. He suggested that the State should therefore prioritize the RKVY projects accordingly.

Dr. Vijay Kumar Teotia, Regional Officer, Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, GoI requested ARD Department to emphasize on taking up Rabies Control Programme even from RKVY (Normal) fund and strengthening of animal healthcare infrastructure.



- i. Having no critical points raised by any of the members on implementation of these projects, the house unanimously approved all eighty eight (88) new project proposals recommended by the SLPSC including ratification of projects approved by the Chairman. Detailed list of approved projects is given in **Annexure-I**.
- ii. The Stakeholder Departments were requested to prioritise the projects before implementation to keep it within financial limits.
- iii. The Chairman, SLSC suggested all stakeholder Departments to complete the ongoing projects with top priority and review the spill-over projects before taking up.
- iv. ARD Department will take into account the suggestions of the Department of Animal Husbandry & Dairying and include projects accordingly.

# Agenda II(vi): Review of utilization of fund under BGREI for 2020-21:

The Approved Action Plan for BGREI during 2020-21 was of Rs. 82.13 crores which comprised of unspent balance of 2019-20 (Rs. 5.42 crores) and fresh allocation of Rs. 76.71 crores (Central Share: Rs. 46.03 crores & State Share: Rs. 30.68 crores); however, only Rs. 66.18 crores was received during the year (Central Share: Rs. 39.71 crores & State Share: Rs. 26.47 crores) (Annexure-II).

100% of unspent balance and 99% fresh receipt have been utilized during the year. Currently there is unspent balance of Rs. 0.68 crores (Central Share: Rs. 0.43 crores & State Share: Rs. 0.25 crores) under BGREI with committed liability for the same.

Moreover, due to short release, there is a further committed liability of Rs. 1.54 crores (Central Share: Rs. 0.93 crores & State Share: Rs. 0.61 crores) for the intervention 'Site Specific Activities'.

Hence, GOI is requested to release a further fund of Rs. 0.93 crores as Central Share (60%) to meet up the said committed liabilities due to short release of fund during 2020-21.

Vide letter No.7-2/2021-RKVY dt. 14/05/2021 the DAC&FW informed that the BGREI has been subsumed within NFSM from 2021-22 and the arrear liabilities, if any, may be met up from RKVY (Normal) fund; thus the same may be done accordingly.



Agriculture Department will send proposal accordingly to Government of India for release of funds to meet committed liabilities of 2020-21.

# Agenda II

(vii): Approval of RKVY sub-scheme BGREI Annual Action Plan for the year 2021-22

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised the house that the Annual Action Plan (AAP) of BGREI for the year 2021-22 with a total outlay of Rs.100.00 crores was sent to GoI on 11/02/2021 with due recommendation of SLPSC. However, GoI has informed vide No.7-2/2021-RKVY dt. 14/05/2021 that it has been proposed to subsume the BGREI sub-scheme with the National Food Security Mission (NFSM) for the period from 2021-22 to 2024-25; approval of the new EFC is however still awaited. Accordingly, a proposal for approval of revised AAP under NFSM-2021-22, incorporating BGREI programme of 2021-22, has been submitted to DAC & FW but comments on the same is still awaited. BGREI mainly provides support to Kharif HYV Paddy, but the season being already started, it is becoming difficult to pursue the activities proposed in this programme.

# **Decision:**

The Chairman, SLSC requested Shri P. K. Swain, Addl. Secretary, DAC&FW to take up the issue with appropriate authorities and consider approval of AAP of Rs. 100 crores as submitted to DAC & FW for 2021-22.

# Agenda II

(viii):Review of Crop Diversification Programme (CDP) under RKVY for Replacing Tobacco farming with alternate crops/cropping system 2019-20 and 2020-21

During 2019-20 an amount of Rs. 0.15 crores (Central Share + State Share) was released as 1st instalment out of approved outlay of Rs. 0.31 crores (Central Share + State Share). Full utilization certificate of Rs. 0.15 crores (1st instalment) has been submitted to GOI on 20/02/2020. Annual Action Plan of CDP during 2020-21 with financial outlay of Rs 46.20 lakhs (Central Share + State Share) was sent to GOI on 17/06/2020 but no fund is released as yet by GOI.

Agriculture Department proposed an Annual Action Plan of 2021-22 against Allocation is Rs 46.20 lakhs (Central Share + State Share) for approval.



The House approved the Annual Action Plan of 2021-22 under CDP amounting Rs 46.20 lakhs (Annexure-III) and requested the Nodal Officer of DAC&FW for the State to kindly to ensure regular fund flow of this sub-scheme.

# Agenda II(ix): RKVY-RAFTAAR Sub-scheme: Area Expansion of Cashew

The sub-scheme is being implemented by FPI&H Department. 1<sup>st</sup> instalment amounting to Rs. 0.18 crores Central Share and 0.12 crores State Share have been released. All works have been completed.

#### Decision:

The house highlighted the importance of the scheme in this state and requested the FPI&H Department to take up with GoI for suitable support for the scheme.

# Agenda II

# (x): Review of new sub-scheme – 'Brucellosis Control' implemented by ARD during 2018-19

The project namely, "Brucellosis Control Programme in the State of West Bengal" under Animal Health sub-scheme under RKVY 2018-19 has been approved in FY 2018-19 with a project cost of Rs 3.75 crores. GOI released Rs.1.125 crores vide No. 1-29/2018-RKVY Dt. 22/01/19; matching state share of Rs. 0.75 crores has also been credited in the FY 2019-20. The fund for Brucellosis Control Programme amounting Rs. 1.875 crores (Central Share + State Share) is yet to be utilized owing to unsuccessful Tender.

# Review of new sub-scheme - "Animal Health Sub-scheme" 2019-20:

For this scheme implemented by Animal Resources Development Department, Rs. 1.38 crores has been released as (Central Share: Rs. 0.83 crores & State Share: Rs. 0.55 crores) during 2019-20 as 1<sup>st</sup> instalment. 4% fund of Glanders Surveillance in W.B. has been utilized.

### **Decision:**

The house requested the Special Secretary, ARD Department to resolve issues and implement the programmes in a time bound manner.



# Agenda II(xi): Ratification of RKVY unspent fund for time bound implementation.

For time-bound utilization, in concurrence with Finance Department, balance RKVY (Normal) fund of 2018-19 and 2019-20 was surrendered by the Departments of Fisheries (Rs 31.5579 crores) and WRID (Rs. 5.27 crores) and the same was re-allotted to Agriculture (Rs 29.0579 crores), I&W (Rs 3.5 crores) and ARD (Rs 4.27 crores). The house may kindly note and ratify the same.

#### **Decision:**

The house appreciated the fund management taken up by the stakeholder and the nodal Departments to help the State to receive 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of 2020-21.

# Agenda II (xii): Abandoned/discontinued RKVY projects.

All Stakeholder Departments have been requested to submit list of abandoned / discontinued projects.

#### **Decision:**

The house requested all stakeholder Departments to review all the approved projects, list the abandoned / discontinued projects and suitably update the entries in RDMIS.

# Agenda II (xiii): Miscellaneous.

# 1. Geo-tagging:

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised the house that Geo-tagging of all assets created under RKVY is being emphasized and 18,275 assets have been geo-tagged against target of 25,000 fixed by GOI.

#### Decision:

All stakeholder Department have been requested to complete Geo-tagging of pending RKVY assets in a time bound manner.

# 2. RDMIS (RKVY Database Management Information System):

The Secretary, Agriculture Department emphasised on uploading progress of all RKVY-RAFTAAR projects in the RDMIS portal by the stakeholder Departments.

#### **Decision:**

8

The stakeholder Departments has been requested to update pending entries within a month and continue updating it on regular pace to have real time monitoring.

# 3. Third Party Evaluation of RKVY projects:

The Nodal Department (Agriculture) conducted Third Party Evaluation of RKVY projects for the period 2012-13 to 2015-16. Now, it is proposed that Third Party Evaluation of RKVY projects for the period 2016-17 to 2020-21 would be done by engaging an Agency.

### **Decision:**

The house requested the nodal Department to go ahead with support of Stakeholder Departments.

4. Preparation of District Agriculture Plan (DAP), State Agriculture Plan (SAP) and State Agriculture Infrastructure Development Programme (SAIDP):

The Govt. of India has informed that RKVY-RAFTAAR will continue till 2024-25. The State needs to prepare DAP, SAP & SAIDP following RKVY Guidelines. The State Nodal Department (Agriculture) will take initiative in this regard soon. Previously SAP and SAIDP for the period 2017-18 to 2019-20 were prepared with the help of the NABCONS.

#### **Decision:**

The house requested the nodal Department to go ahead with support of Stakeholder Departments.

# 5. Approval of pending project of 2020-21:

The DAC&FW, GOI communicated observations of ICAR on 17.01.2021, i.e. after holding of last SLSC dated 23.12.2020, for 2020-21 project "Promotion of integrated farming through land shaping & rain water harvesting for augmenting agricultural productivity in the South 24 Parganas district of West Bengal" with project cost of Rs. 0.66 crores, to be implemented by KVK, Nimpith. This may be approved for implementation.

### **Decision:**

The house approved the proposal.



# Agenda-III: ATMA (Agricultural Technology Management Agency) Programme

# (i) Review of State Extension Work Plan (SEWP), ATMA 2020-21:

The Secretary, Agriculture Department apprised the house that during 2020-21 an amount of Rs.81.06 crores (Central Share - Rs. 48.63 crores and State Share - Rs. 32.42 crores) was released for implementation of State Extension Work Plan (SEWP), ATMA. The fund has been fully utilized.

### **Decision:**

The house noted the performance of ATMA 2020-21.

# (ii) Approval of State Extension Work Plan (SEWP), 2021-22 ATMA Programme:

The house was further apprised that State Extension Work Plan (Annual Action Plan) of Rs. 132.35 crores has been submitted to Govt. of India after obtaining in-principle approval by the Chairman, SLSC & Chief Secretary, West Bengal on 04.06.2021.

# The SEWP 2021-22 includes the following components:

- 1) District level farmers oriented activities like Farm Schools, training and visits, demonstration clusters on crops etc.: Rs. 65.20 Crores
- 2) Administrative cost of ATMA set up and remuneration to project staff at all levels: Rs. 64.30 crores.
- 3) State level activities and State Agriculture Management & Extension Training Institute (SAMETI): Rs. 2.18 crores.

The SEWP 2021-22 (Annexure-IV) was submitted for ratification of the SLSC.

#### **Decision:**

The house ratified the State Extension Work Plan (SEWP) 2021-22 under ATMA (Annexure-IV).



# Agenda-IV: Implementation of PMKSY & BKSY in West Bengal

(i) Approval of proposal for New Generation Watershed Development projects along with total project proposal for five years (from 2021-22 to 2025-26).

The preparation of projects for New Generation Watershed Development has been taken up. In the absence of cost norms and Guidelines from GoI, the work could not be progressed beyond identification of projects. The matter was also discussed in the previous SLSC dated 23.10.2021.

Shri Rajesh Kumar Singh, Director (WM), Department of Land Resources, Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India apprised the house that the Guideline for the New Generation Watershed Development Projects including cost norms is under consideration of the competent authority and is likely to come out shortly.

### **Decision:**

The CEO & Secretary, WBSWDA will submit the proposal after receiving the Guideline including cost norms from Government of India and on obtaining clearance of the Department.

(ii) Approval of Annual Action Plan of FY 2021-22 for PMKSY-Watershed Development and New Generation Watershed Development

Annual Action Plan for PMKSY – Watershed Development for the FY 2021-22 of amounting Rs. 13.27 crores has been proposed for approval (Annexure-V); fund for the same is lying with the CEO, WBSWDA.

For New Generation Watershed Development projects, discussion held in agenda IV(i).

#### **Decision:**

The Annual Action Plan for PMKSY-Watershed Development (existing projects) amounting Rs. 13.27 crores has been approved (Annexure-V).

(iii) Approval of Annual Action Plan of FY 2021-22 for Bangla Krishi Sech Yojana in association with PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop



The Annual Action Plan for PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop for FY 2021-22 amounting Rs. 101.05 crores (Central Share: Rs. 60.63 crores, State Share: Rs. 40.42 crores) has been placed before the house (Annexure-VI). The coverage is

within the approved State Irrigation Plan (SIP). This includes AAP of "Namami Ganga" amounting Rs 8.80 crores.

Shri Pankaj Tyagi, Director (RFS), Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers Welfare, Government of India also recommended the proposal.

Proposal for additional top-up subsidy under Bangla Krishi Sech Yojana (BKSY) 2021-22 amounting to Rs. 59.03 crores (under SDS) has also been placed before the house for consideration.

#### **Decision:**

The house considered and approved the Annual Action Plan for 2021-22 of PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop (PDMC) amounting Rs. 101.05 crores and that of Bangla Krishi Sech Yojana (BKSY) amounting to Rs. 59.03 crores for the FY 2021-22 (Annexure-VI).

# (iv) Action Taken Report on SLSC Meeting held on 23/12/2020

The Action Taken Report was placed before the house for appraisal. (Annexure-VII)

# (v) Approval of new registration of M/s. Bharat Drip Irrigation and Agro as Micro Irrigation manufacturer under PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop.

The house was informed that M/s. Bharat Drip Irrigation and Agro of Jaipur, Rajasthan has applied for registering as Micro Irrigation Manufacturer for supply of Portable Sprinkler system, Drip Irrigation system and Mini Sprinkler system in farmer's field of West Bengal. The MI Company has been registered in the states of Uttarakhand, Bihar, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand. The existing system of quality control as per Clause 17 of the Operational Guideline of PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop, Government of India, as is being followed involving CIPET, Haldia after due approval of SLSC, will also be applicable for this company.

The proposal for registration of M/s. Bharat Drip Irrigation and Agro as new MI Manufacturer has been discussed. CEO & Secretary of WBSWDA appraised that the documents on compliance of technical specifications as per BIS standards have been examined and found in order.



The Registration of new MI Manufacturer, M/s. Bharat Drip Irrigation and Agro has been approved by the house for the period up to 31/03/2023 for working under PMKSY-PDMC / BKSY in West Bengal.

vi) Appraisal of extension of time for completion and closure of ongoing Batch-IV PMKSY-Watershed Development projects

SLSC has been appraised that the Department of Land Resources (DoLR), Government of India has approved extension of Batch-IV project period up to 30/09/2021 under PMKSY-Watershed Development. The DoLR, Government of India has allowed the project extension period of Batch-IV PMKSY-Watershed Development projects up to 30/09/2021.

### **Decision:**

The house noted it and requested the CEO to follow the time-line and submit project completion reports on time.

vii) Miscellaneous: Inclusion of "Bargadars" as Beneficiary for getting the benefits under PMKSY-Per Drop More Crop (PDMC).

At present farmers in possession of land i.e. having ROR are considered as beneficiaries under PMKSY-PDMC scheme. In West Bengal a good number of farmers cultivate land as "Bargadars". But they are not considered as "beneficiaries" in terms of existing guidelines of PMKSY. It has been proposed to include the "recorded Bargadars" as beneficiaries under the scheme.

Shri Pankaj Tyagi, Director (RFS), Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmer Welfare, Government of India commented that a new Guideline on PMKSY-PDMC is under preparation. The issue may be considered at that time by GOI.

#### **Decision:**

The matter may be taken up with Government of India accordingly.
